


- Identifying features of a powerful CV




The Ealing Club will forever be remembered as the birthplace of British rhythm and blues, the Rolling Stones and other legends of the music industry.







YOUNG ADULT BOOK REVIEW

Recommended by Matthew Jenkins, Duke of Edinburgh Award volunteer







The drought, or the Tap-Out, is a climate crisis affecting the whole of California. But one day, the water runs out completely. Suddenly, Alyssa's quiet suburban neighbourhood descends into a warzone of desperation, with families turning against each other on the hunt for water. Her life – and the life of her brother – is at risk, and Alyssa will have to make impossible choices in order to survive.

"Personally, I thought Dry was an amazing book. Reading it felt like watching a disaster movie, it created a very convincing portrayal of the apocalyptic scenario. One aspect I really liked was the variety of characters in the book. Each character had an interesting perspective to read from, and the switching viewpoints in the novel helped emphasise the scale of the situation.

With only 400 pages, this book is packed with action, drama and plot twists. This novel was dark and violent at times, but it added to the realism of the story, with the potential for it to one day be real makes it all the more scary. The conclusion was short but satisfying, although it could have had more clarity as to what had happened to some of the minor characters.

Overall, I found this book to be a tense, thrilling read, which I would definitely recommend."
