Non fiction: "One Two Three Four: The Beatles In Time" by Craig Brown

CULTURAL RESOURCES

From Thursday 9 April, **Jane Eyre**, the collaboration between Bristol Old Vic and the National Theatre, will be available to watch for one week as part of the [National Theatre At Home](#) programme. This production will be followed by Treasure Island by Bryony Lavery on Thursday 16 April and William Shakespeare's Twelfth Night on Thursday 23 April.

[The Royal Shakespeare Company](#) are streaming a number of productions such as Shakespeare's **King Lear** and Tim Crouch's **I, Cinna**. They also run interactive online backstage tours and provide a range of free resources for young people to enable them learn from home, including live lessons on Macbeth and Romeo and Juliet.

[Fleabag for Charity](#) - Phoebe Waller-Bridge's stage play **Fleabag** will be available to watch online on the Soho Theatre's website to raise money for charities helping stop the coronavirus pandemic.

Andrew Lloyd Webber has now made a selection of his musical theatre shows free to watch.

You can stream **Jesus Christ Superstar** from Friday 10th April at 7pm BST on **The Shows Must Go On** YouTube channel. It will be available for 48 hours, so you can tune in whenever you like over the weekend. Over the next 7 weeks you'll be able to watch more of the best loved Andrew Lloyd Webber musicals.
